

January holidays



January 19th Martin Luther King Day

Martin Luther King Jr. Day (officially Birthday of Martin Luther King Jr., and often referred to shorthand as MLK Day) is a federal holiday in the United States observed on the third Monday of January each year. King was the chief spokesperson for nonviolent activism in the Civil Rights Movement, which protested racial discrimination in federal and state law and civil society. The movement led to several groundbreaking legislative reforms in the United States.

Born in 1929, Martin Luther King Jr.'s actual birthday is January 15 (which in 1929 fell on a Tuesday). The earliest Monday for this holiday is January 15 and the latest is January 21. The Monday observance is similar for those federal holidays which fall under the Uniform Monday Holiday Act.

The campaign for a federal holiday in King's honor began soon after his assassination in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983, and it was first observed three years later on January 20, 1986. At first, some states resisted observing the holiday as such, giving it alternative names or combining it with other holidays.

Some humorous holidays in January

January 24th National Peanut Butter Day

National Peanut Butter Day on January 24th recognizes an American staple in our pantries. Whether creamy or chunky, with chocolate or with jelly, peanut butter gets the recognition it deserves each year on this day.

The early peanut butter made by the Aztecs and Incas around 1000 BC was more of a paste and not nearly as creamy as the peanut butter we know now.

Peanut butter didn't become widely used until the 20th century. First, the peanut had to be considered more than animal feed, which wasn't until the late 1800s. At the turn of the century, inventions that made planting, cultivating, and harvesting the legume (the peanut isn't a nut at all) made it possible to see peanuts as a retail and wholesale food item.

Make your favorite peanut butter recipes. Whether it's a sandwich or baked good, someone is sure to enjoy it with you. Be sure to share a photo or recipe using #NationalPeanutButterDay on social media.



January 16th National “Nothing” Day

Each year on January 16th, people across the nation recognize National Nothing Day.

The observance was created as a day to provide Americans with one National Day when they can just sit without celebrating, observing or honoring anything.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day falls on the third Monday of January which means that one-in-seven January 16ths will fall on the same day as Nothing Day, effectively usurping the nature of Nothing Day.

While it may be a good day to celebrate nothing at all, we suppose putting nothing in a glass and setting it on a table might suffice for celebration. You might leave your diary page blank every January 16th. Don't mark anything on the calendar on the 16th, either. It would be interesting to see what would happen if you sent a blank email dated January 16th. How many replies would you get saying, "There's nothing here."

For people whose birthday lands on January 16th, wrap an empty box. That should elicit a "nothing" response appropriate for the celebration.

When asked, "What are your plans today?" your response should be, "Nothing." What else would your answer be on a day like today? Now that we think about it, "Nothing" works well as an answer when recognizing the day.

Q: What's supper? A: Nothing

Q: What are you reading? A. Nothing. (Even though you're clearly reading something.)

Q. What are you drinking? A. Nothing. (As you sip on a very nice glass of wine.)

I think you get the picture.....

Be Kind to Servers Month

Be Kind to Food Servers Month is observed every January to honor the individuals in the food serving industry.

Did you know tips were introduced in the late 1800s by wealthy Americans returning from Europe? Tipping, which began to ensure quality service from waiters, has evolved into the primary way of expressing kindness and appreciation. Since its introduction, tipping has become a custom and formed the basis of the tipped wage. The latter has sparked much controversy, leaving many waiters dissatisfied with their earnings.

Be Kind to Food Servers Month was established to raise awareness of wage disparities and urge customers to tip more generously.

We will be delivering a letter to each home approximately 10 days prior to the Bake Sale.



Again, this month we agreed on our selection for December, The Redbird Christmas by Fanny Flagg. We rated it 4.5 out of 5. It is not just a good Christmas story, but a good read in general. The main character, Oswald T. Campbell, is told by his doctor that he should leave his home in windy Chicago and move to a warmer climate to improve his health and extend his life. Even though he is not comfortable with change, he ends up in a very small community in Alabama called Lost River. There, over time, he makes friends with his landlady Francis and her sister Mildred, the owner of the only store in town, and Roy and his pet cardinal, Jack. There is a very special little girl, Patsy, who finds her way into the whole town's heart. Fanny Flagg has become one of my favorite authors because she writes folksy, small-town stories, usually with a happy ending. She also wrote Fried Green Tomatoes and The Wonder Boy of Whistle Stop and a host of others. I'm planning on reading more of her books on my own.

Looking ahead to our meeting on January 8th we have chosen The Call of the Camino by Susan Redford. Many of our group have had problems finding a copy. If you are trying to search for one, make sure you include the author's name because there are several different books with that title.

We also have selected First Love by Beverly Lewis for the February 12th meeting. It is the story of a young Amish woman struggling with illness. For March we decided on Cross Creek by Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings who also was the author of the Yearling. Both books take place in Florida.
